What can you study?

Bachelor of Science Degree in Education that includes teacher licensure as an option at Central State (already have a Bachelor's? This will be a second degree)

- 1) Ohio Resident Educator Teaching License Early Childhood (PK-Grade 3) Equivalent to California Multiple Subject Credential
- 2) Ohio Resident Educator Teaching License Intervention Specialist (Mild/Moderate) – Equivalent to a California Education Specialist Credential (Mild/Moderate)
- 3) Educational Studies (no teacher licensure)



California Credential Equivalents

Multiple Subject

(PK-Grade 12) (Self-Contained Classrooms)

(Self-contained is usually found at PK-Grade 5 level at elementary schools) (Can teach core classes at middle school level)

Education Specialist – Mild/Moderate



Eligibility



To get into Central State for the Bachelor of Science in Education, you need at least 30 prior college credits

The degree program is 120 to 124 credits total

Minimum 2.2 GPA

Once enrolled you must bring the GPA up to at least 3.0 before formally admitted to the College of Education



Key Information - Teaching

Courses are online except:

Student Teaching - In the last term, 12 weeks of full-time student teaching are required. You will need to take an unpaid leave of absence to fulfill this requirement. Plan ahead on how you will cover expenses during this time. Note: You are able to take student loans of up to \$1,000 per semester throughout your degree program.

Clinical Experiences - Before student teaching there are some online courses that require time in the classroom over the sixteen weeks.



How does the Financial side work?

- 1) Each student is charged for tuition, books, and student fees in their student account at the college
- 2) Pell grant monies awarded to the student from their FAFSA are applied to tuition, books, and student fees
- 3) "Last dollar" scholarship from the college is applied to bring the student account to zero.
- 4) Not eligible for Pell grants or DACA? Student is fully covered by the last dollar scholarship.



Getting Started

Go to www.csea.com/education

Scroll down to the "Ready to Get Started? It's Easy!" section and follow steps 1 through 5.

Steps 1 and 2 are the **interest form and application form** and these two steps take about 20 minutes total. Then complete the FAFSA and have all prior college transcripts submitted. (Foreign transcripts must be evaluated first by an agency such as World Education Services wes.org)

Wait for an admissions decision and transcript evaluation.
