we have a list of supplies most commonly used by students in first grade for the year. As students run out, we need to have more items readily available in our community supplies. Personal use only items must have your child's name on them in black Sharpie. Please do not open the packages of community donations. You can bring all items to school with your child on the first day of class inside of a shopping bag with your child's name on it.

- 2 Plastic 2-Pocket Folders with clear overlay-Any Color[Mrs. Stanfield]
- 1 Clear Zipper Pouch (for the take-home binder)
- Plastic Clear Pencil case to hold all desk supplies (Write Name on the Top Please)
- 2 Packages #2 pencils (Ticonderoga are best)
- Sharpened -NO Refillable Electronic Pencils Please
- 2 Pentel Hi-Polymer Block Erasers, Large
- 2 boxes of 24 count crayons (Write Name on the Box Please)
- 2 boxes of 24 count Color Pencils (Write Name on the Box Please)
- 5 Expo Board Markers-Black
- Highlighters 3 of each color (yellow, pink, blue)
- Fiskars Scissors-no sharp tips please (Write Name on the Scissors Blades Please)
- NO Handheld Pencil Sharpeners Please (they have blades inside that can be exposed when the sharpeners break)
