CSEA offers the chance to complete a bachelor's degree online from accredited university partners at no-cost.

Earn your Teaching Credential

There is an option to earn your teaching credential at nocost as part of the Bachelor of Science in Education degree program.

What are the requirements?

Applicants must have an Associate degree or at least 60 transferable credits, and a minimum cumulative 2.2 GPA

How does the financial side work?

The benefit is a "last-dollar scholarship", or grant, that fills the gap between any federal, state or employer education grants you receive and the cost of tuition, fees and e-books. Every applicant is required to complete the FAFSA in order to determine the amount of the "last-dollar scholarship". Even if the applicant does not qualify for federal or other grants, they will still be eligible for this scholarship benefit.

What can you study?

Bachelor's degrees are currently offered in Education, Management/Leadership, Criminal Justice, and Liberal Arts/Social Science.
