School Profile

Eagle Ranch is one of 14 schools in the Adelanto Elementary School District. Eagle Ranch has a population of 559 and is served by a dedicated staff. Both staff and parents comment on the positive changes that are ongoing at Eagle Ranch. Eagle Ranch has programs and strategies in place that are continually being improved to provide a safe learning environment with high expectations of students and staff. Eagle Ranch hosts several parent/student functions during the school year, to emphasize the strong community bond with the school. We are here to serve our diverse and close-knit community.

Comprehensive Needs

Eagle Ranch uses a combination of parent, teacher, and student surveys to gather information about needs/wants from our school community. LCAP Survey: According to the LCAP survey conducted by the district for the 2019/2020 School Year Eagle Ranch received some valuable feedback. Parents are satisfied with the quality of education their child receives and feel Eagle Ranch is a safe environment to send their students to during the day. One area of improvement is in Parent/School Communication. Parents stated that they would like different options for school meetings. Some parents can't make it due to the scheduled times. This feedback will be used to better communicate between the school and parents.

Classroom observations are done both formally and informally throughout the school year. Administrators walk through and currently visit by ZOOM daily. Best Practices are observed and shared.

Assessments are used to drive instruction and determine next steps. Eagle Ranch uses the following state assessments to evaluate student growth: SBAC, IBA's and CAST, ELPAC is used for our English Learners. District Benchmarks (STAR Renaissance Reading/Math, Lexia, ESGI) are also used at the school site to assess student learning and growth.

The families of Eagle Ranch receive information from the school through All Call, handouts, social media, during Parent/Teacher Conferences, Back to School Night, Open House, PTA, and parent committees. Eagle Ranch has various parent committees that collaborate with the school and meet regularly to include SSC, PTA, ELAC, Coffee with the Principal, and AAPAC in the progress of being established.







LCAP Goal 2: Pupil Outcomes

SPSA Goal 2: Student achievement will increase in ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies/History, with a focus on closing the achievement gap for struggling students. The current data for Eagle Ranch shows an overall Exceed/Met in ELA at 23.4% and overall Exceed/Met in Math at 17.3%. Students at Eagle Ranch will obtain a 5% growth as measured by the CAASPP for Reading/Language Arts and CAASPP for Math. The following subgroups currently show scores below the current overall school percentages, and therefore Eagle Ranch will also focus on these subgroups to obtain a 5% growth in the following specified areas: English Learners (ELA and Math); African American (ELA) and Students with Disabilities (ELA).
